Easter Message 2023

My Rabboni, My Teacher.

A Blessed Easter to you and your family, my brothers and sisters. We praise God for His favour and blessings this Easter. This year we see an increase of worshippers coming back for in-person Holy Week Services in TRAC Churches. We praise and thank God for the holy gatherings of His people, as we resume our rich Methodist tradition, celebrating God's love for us in His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. And this is God's words, *"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"* Truly, we are an Easter people, a new creation in Christ. Amen!

In the Old Testament, in Deuteronomy Chapter 6, God prepares His people to take possession of their new life in the Promised Land. God instructs them, "These are the commands, decrees and laws the Lord your God directed me to teach you to observe in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess, so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the Lord your God as long as you live by keeping all His decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life. Hear, Israel, **and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you** and that you may increase greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the Lord, the God of your ancestors, promised you."

Similarly, in the New Testament, Jesus Christ prepares His disciples and us to take possession of our new life as Christians. Jesus instructs and teaches in John Chapters 14; saying, "If you love Me, keep My commands. And I will ask the Father, and HE will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever the Spirit of truth." And Jesus continues, "Anyone who loves Me **will obey My teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them** and make our home with them."

Obedience is the common denominator. How do you view obedience? Oftentimes, we relate obedience with submission and surrendering. We view it as an act. Obedience is more than that. Obedience has to do with the human condition, not merely human action. Firstly, there is a change in our condition, we are a new creation in the Risen Christ. Secondly, we obey God out of love, not fear. The condition of heart is changed to one that loves Christ. Jesus says, "Anyone who loves Me will obey My teaching." The third change in the human condition is that we are no longer sinners separated from God, we are God's children, His beloved sons and daughters. A blessed Easter, brothers and sisters. And God's blessings and favour be with you and your loved ones.

Pendahuluan

Mereka menyambut kami seperti orang terpenting, padahal kami merasakan diri kami seperti biasa-biasa sahaja, inilah kasih Tuhan yang luar biasa kami dapat lihat. Setiap pasangan dikhaskan bilik yang begitu bagus dan selesa, disitu kami percaya setiap Pastor dan Guru Injil mengalami keadaan yang bahagia kerana mungkin sebahagian daripada kami tidak mempunyai keselesaan bilik seperti itu, apatah lagi bilik berhawa dingin.

Selain itu juga, kami dimeriahkan dengan permainan yang sesuai sepanjang kem itu berjalan. Kami merasakan amat terhibur dan senang sekali, lebih-lebih lagi disediakan dengan hadiah untuk setiap pemenang. Walaupun sederhana tetapi berharga bagi kami kerana bukan senang bagi orang yang menyediakan.



Kem ini bertema “BEREHAT, PEMULIHAN, SEMANGAT”, kami tidak menemukan erti tema itu ketika menikmati makan dan minum atau ketika diadakan berbagai acara yang lain akan tetapi kami menemui erti itu ketika setiap hamba-hamba Tuhan memberkati kami dengan Firman Tuhan.

Masih kami ingat lagi setiap pengkhotbah secara urutan bermula didedikasikan oleh:

Rev Ronald Yap dari Amsal 5:1-23
(tentang tujuan berkhawin adalah memenuhi hasrat Tuhan).

Rev Abraham Chung dari Matius 11: 28-30
(tujuan datang kepada Tuhan adalah kamu akan di anugerahkan kelegaan yang luar biasa).

Rev Eddy Marson dari Lukas 5: 1-11
(diberi judul “Anjakan Baru” ada tiga hal yang didefinisikan: DIPILIH OLEH ALAH, MASUK LEBIH DALAM, KETAATAN. Dan akibat dari tiga itu, kita boleh menemukan erti IDENTITI BARU, yaitu menjadi penjala manusia.).

Bishop Joshua dari Efesus 5: 23-33
(mengenai pasangan hidup yang perlu hidup dalam kekudusan, diakhiri dengan sebuah motivasi: menjadualkan waktu-waktu pemulihan keluarga, itu adalah keharusan bukan pilihan.).

Setelah kami diberkati dengan Firman Tuhan biarlah kami juga memberkati pengalaman itu kepada gereja-gereja kami dan keluarga kami yang lain. Dan akhir sekali kami juga sangat-sangat diberkati seperti sebuah pepatah ini, datang dengan dua beg pulang dengan enam bag, maksudnya kerana membawa pulang hadiah yang diberkati oleh team KM3.

Harapan kami Pastor-Pastor dan Para Guru Injil. Semoga akan datang ada lagi kem seperti ini, siapapun yang menaja Tuhan pasti memberkati mereka. Puji Tuhan, semuanya diberkati oleh Tuhan kita Yesus Kristus.

Perjumpaan antara ahli Jawatankuasa Petugas untuk Transformasi Persidangan Misi Sengoi Methodist telah berjumpa di Beacon Resort Tanjung Malim, 28 Feb - 1 Mac 2023, untuk sesi perancangan tahun 2023, analisis keadaan semasa dan sumbangsaran untuk maju ke hadapan.

Agenda yang telah dibentangkan bertujuan untuk memberi ruang bagi semua yang terlibat supaya berkongsi pendapat dan perspektif mereka dari segi apa yang perlu untuk PMSM berdikari. Ternyata pendapat ahli-ahli PMSM amat penting dalam perbincangan ini dan ia hanya merupakan titik permulaan bagi kerja yang perlu untuk memperkuat PMSM bagi tujuan mereka pentadbiran sendiri (self governing), pembiayaan sendiri (self resourcing) dan penyebaran diri (self propagating).



2 Tempat Perjumpaan Terbuka



Perbualan Petugas banyak menyentuh kepada isu pemuridan Pastor, Pekerja, Pemimpin, Ahli Jawatankuasa, Belia, Kanak-Kanak dan Jemaat PMSM. Banyak usul yang dipertikaikan namun persetujuan umum terdapat tentang pentingnya pemuridan semua pengikut Yesus Kristus supaya mereka semua mengetahui dengan lebih mendalam firman Tuhan dan hidup taat beriman mengikut perintah Yesus Kristus. Dalam isu ini, ahli petugas bersetuju untuk bergabung tenaga supaya menimba sumber dan pengalaman dari pekerja Misi Korea, IMC, Wawasan Penabur dan Gereja TRAC untuk melaksanakan kerja pemuridan yang sepatutnya.

Selain dari isu pemuridan, juga dibangkitkan isu disiplin dan penyeliaan tanggungjawab dari segi watak Elder, Deakon, Guru Injil dan Pemimpin di-dalam PMSM. Beberapa perkara dibincangkan yang berkaitan dengan perlunya setiap pekerja PMSM yang menerima panggilan Tuhan untuk melayani di gereja dibantu memenuhi panggilan mereka, disokong apabila menempuh kesusahan dan ditegur apabila mereka mengabaikan tanggungjawab mereka. Petugas semua bersetuju bahawa prinsip prinsip tadbir urus, pengurusan dan akauntabiliti harus di titik beratkan dan dilaksanakan di dalam semua gereja PMSM.

Ahli Jawatankuasa Petugas juga mengimbas isu kurikulum pemuridan terutamanya bagi tujuan pembaptisan jemaat belia dan dewasa. Perbualan juga menyentuh kelas mingguan kanak kanak, ibu ibu dan Program Belia.

Terdapat focus perbualan tentang isu remaja belia dan dewasa muda kerana banyak antara mereka disasarkan dunia untuk dipengaruhi dan keluar agama atau hilang haluan. Antara usulan yang dipersetujui adalah untuk program pemuridan belia jangkamasa 3-4 tahun dan kerjasama TRAC Board of Youth Work dan IMC untuk menjayakan program bersama yang memupuk persaudaraan Kristian dan juga mendatangkan kematangan iman dalam Yesus Kristus bagi semua yang terlibat.

Trinity Methodist Church Petaling Jaya ushers in the new year with its restored Sanctuary 1

On 15th January 2023, Trinity Methodist Church Petaling Jaya held a combined service of the English-speaking and Chinese-speaking congregations to rededicate her restored Sanctuary One to the glory of God after a 64-week hiatus during which it underwent thorough restoration.

First dedicated by Bishop H.B. Amstutz on 22nd December 1963, the rededication and return of the Sanctuary into a place of prayer and worship enabled the current congregation to experienced what the founding fathers must have felt the first time they stepped into the place of simple beauty and dignity, with its concealed lighting and a ceiling that seems to float effortlessly as lines radiating from the central Cross – which itself appears to be suspended freely in the Altar area.

Brighter, airier and cooler than before, thanks in part to the new lighting complete with chandelier-like fixtures, the new windows and doors, wood-panelled columns and walls and air-conditioning system, what brought the warmth were the hundreds of worshippers who streamed inside with a sense of joyful expectancy to worship our our true and living God.

So exuberant was the rededication service that the worshippers who came could not be contained in Sanctuary 1 and had to overflow to the larger Sanctuary in Trinity Living Stream where they connected to the service via live-streaming.

After putting the new audio and video systems through its paces with exultant praise



and worship songs, Bishop of the Methodist Church in Malaysia, Bishop T. Jeyakumar was invited to the pulpit where he delivered his sermon entitled “Come to Worship”, drawn from Psalm 122.

It was a solemn yet uplifting reminder of the importance of worshipping in Church. Worship and prayer in church are not merely food for the soul, but also an act of faith and service to the Lord and a responsibility of all Christians.

Much like the restoration of Sanctuary 1, which was done in recognition of its legacy and importance to TMCPJ as opposed to merely abandoning it when it was no longer optimum for regular use (given the wear-and-tear over the years), our worship and communion in church is out of reverence for the Lord rather than for our own convenience and pleasure.

After the sermon, Bishop Dr. T. Jeyakumar, Bishop Joshua Khong (TRAC Bishop) together with Pastor-in-Charge of TMCPJ, Rev Paul Christie, led the congregation in the rededication of the restored building of Sanctuary 1, thanking God for his favour in

enabling human works to maintain His earthly house, which embodies the obligation of each generation to impart its treasures of wisdom and knowledge to the next.

The rededication service ended with the unveiling of the rededication Commemorative plaque by Bishop Dr. T. Jeyakumar and Bishop Joshua Khong, witnessed by the church congregation.

It was a Sunday to remember, and may there be many more like it for the ages to come. Amen.



BCE's Talk on "Salvation" by Bishop Dr Gordon Wong on 11 Feb 2023 over zoom

"Salvation" is a "huge" topic for Christians. Christians shares the Good News of Jesus Christ in the hope that the hearers may understand and be saved by Christ in the process. But what is "Salvation" and why do we need to be "saved" in the first place? Are we in any trouble at all? To some, to be saved, is to say a prayer and be baptized. To others, to be saved is to do more good works. Still others, do not think they need to be saved at all! What are we to be saved from? Who saves? And "How are we to be saved?" These are just a few of the basic questions we ask to determine what "Salvation" is all about.

Once we "graduate" from the basic Christian perspectives of salvation on the above queries, we tend to ask further questions regarding "salvation." Usually, these questions come in the following forms:

What am I saved for?

Did God choose me or I chose God?

What about people who have never heard of Jesus?

What happens to people who do not accept Jesus as their Savior?

Can someone lose their salvation?

Can someone be saved without being baptized?

How can I know if I am saved?

Granted, the above may not be worded exactly as listed but at the core of our curiosity is to get answers to the above questions. Some,



if not all of the above questions were indeed asked in the recent BCE talk on this topic.

Zoom has been and continue to be a good platform to get geographically dispersed participants together. A platform of choice if travel is not an option. BCE received 248 registrations for this talk. 167 persons attended.

Bishop Gordon expertly crafted the talk to address these key questions:

Saved For Good?

- Not Saved By but For Good Works? (Ephesians 2:8-10 & Phil 2:12-13)
- Not Saved By Faith but For Faith? (Phil 3:9 & Romans 3:22,26; 8:28)

Once Saved, Always Saved? (Israel in Romans 11; Galatians 6:16; Romans 9:6)

There was an interesting angle in how Bishop Wong looked at Romans 11. He made it simple by categorizing the talk into these bite sized subheadings:

V1-11 Once Fallen, Not Always Fallen

V12-16 Good can arise out of bad

V17-21 Good can become bad (Once In, Not Always In)

V22-23 All can be saved (and all can refuse)

V33-36 To God be all Glory!

The talk was designed with "Question and Answer" sessions in between sub-topics. Expectedly, many questions were asked. Bishop Wong answered every question posed, treating each with much care. Bishop Wong

displayed exceptional skills in being pastoral, comprehensive, and insightful in his responses, always using easy to understand, layman terms to make his points. The attendees, were also highly engaging in this session. Questions were fed into the “zoom chat box” and moderated by Mr. William Lim in order to streamline and get the “Questions & Answers” session done more effectively.



The Unshakable Kingdom

Prayer United, a fellowship of 22 prayer networks, organised its Leaders' Annual Retreat on 14-16/2/23 in Trinity Methodist Church, Kuching. The Retreat Theme was "The Unshakable Kingdom", Hebrews 12:28-29, the focus for the message, prayer and worship.

Prayer United summarised the Theme as follows:

"In the context of Malaysia and the whole world going through a period of instability and unpredictability in various areas of life, believers can walk in confident faith in the Lord. Through seeking the Lord to know His will, devoting themselves in prayer and worship, and being light and salt in God's unshakable Kingdom, we will not be afraid but will fix our eyes on the Author and Finisher of our faith, our Lord Jesus Christ."

The main speakers were MCM Bishop Dr T Jeyakumar, Bishop Emeritus Dr Hwa Yung (PU Chairman), Pastor Raynor Lim and Sis. Chrisanne Chin.

There were about 227 participants who joined the Retreat either in-person or online, out of which 69 of them or 30% were from TRAC, SCAC and SIAC.

1) Highlights from Bishop Dr T Jeyakumar's messages

In his two messages, our Bishop Jeyakumar highlighted the salient points concerning the unshakable Kingdom as follows:

Firstly, faithful living in a rapidly changing world.

a. Focus on God's unshakable Kingdom


Nothing is lasting. No place is secure. The safest place is in the Kingdom of God. Invest in people that they may know the kingdom of God. Help them see the Kingdom of God that our Lord Jesus had already demonstrated. Our first, last and all is God - God's Kingdom. Don't offer programmes as an end in itself. Offer them the Kingdom of God.

b. Uphold moral standards

Live holy lives. Holy lives are attractive. Amid evil around us, living holy lives is powerful.

c. Fear God

God is a loving God. He is also a consuming God. Fear of God will help us to avoid sin and judgment.

In summary: Jesus spoke of the Kingdom of God (Acts 1:3), but the apostles did not get it initially. We are often like that – earth-bound and inward-looking. We need to widen our perspective on the unshakable Kingdom of God.

Secondly, faithful intercessors in a rapidly changing world.

a Pray because God is an unshakable God, and His Kingdom is unshakable.

God’s plan will prevail. Only God is great. Evil is increasing. God is on the throne. Nobody is. We gather on our knees. Our God is charge of everything. When something is catastrophic, at times certain people think God has fallen off His throne or gone through the back door. We don’t fear because of who our God is.

b. Maintain spiritual hunger

Don’t neglect God’s Word. Pray daily. Fast regularly. Don’t forget to fellowship with one another. Worship God, who is good and also a consuming fire. Seek first the Kingdom and His righteousness of God.

In summary: We focus on what God has placed in our hearts. God is able to take care and watch over us. Everything is unstable. But we can trust God. As intercessors, keep our eyes on God and know God’s Kingdom is unshakable. Yearn for intimacy with God.

2) Quotable quotes

Here are some selected quotable quotes from the three other speakers:

- + “For us, no mission is impossible. When God is present, it matters not who is in power. Give me Malaysia or I die!” (Bishop Emeritus Dr Hwa Yung)
- + “Don’t sell God like a product which we can use. Rather let God use us for His purpose.” (Bishop Emeritus Dr Hwa Yung)
- + “Prayer movement must be a mission movement (i.e. proclamation of gospel of the Kingdom).” (Chrisanne Chin)

Marriage and Parenting Seminar by Board of Laity on 7 January 2023

CD1 & CD2 jointly organized the Marriage and Parenting Seminar on behalf of the Board of Laity (BOL) which was held at Wesley Methodist Church, Kuala Lumpur on Saturday, 7th January 2023. The speakers were Dr. Chong Kwong Tek and Mrs. Goldie Chong. Dr. Chong, who was the first Conference Lay Leader for TRAC, and his wife are currently residing in Australia. They were so kind to accept our invitation to present this seminar when they were back in Malaysia for holiday then.

The seminar was a half day event attended by 27 registered participants.

The first part of the seminar was mainly on marriage and Dr. & Mrs. Chong shared with us their experiences and struggles in their early cross-cultural marriage life (Mr Chong grew up in Melaka while Mrs. Chong grew up in Hong Kong), the importance of good and effective communication between the husband and wife, especially in using word of life to encourage one another rather than the use of negative words. Two important values that they shared: We are priests to those close to us and we are pastors in our family (1 Peter 2:9). They also shared with us the Luke 10 Strategy and used skits to demonstrate their points.

The second part of the seminar was on parenting. The speakers highlighted the importance of parents in the training and instruction of the child (Eph 6:4) and not leaving the responsibility to the church, the youth groups or the Sunday School. As in

Deuteronomy 11:18-20, parents are to use every opportunity and occasions to share about God to their children. We are reminded to start the practice from young, practice “table talk” where parents to share their own struggles before asking the children about their struggles. Parents are also reminded to pray for their children and to persevere in praying. Towards the end, Dr. and Mrs Chong shared a touching personal testimony on their parenting journey and how God has helped them in their struggles and how God has redeemed the family. Glory to God!

The seminar started with a worship session led by CD2 District Superintendent & Associate Pastor of Wesley Methodist Church, KL, Rev Ashok Amarasingham, and ended with a Q&A session followed by lunch fellowship.

“Sheau Yin and I found the Marriage and Parenting seminar to be thoroughly enjoyable as Dr. Kwong and Goldie were very candid about their joys and struggles with marriage and parenting. They often drew on their life experiences and this made the content very relatable. The skit they presented at the start of the seminar on the interaction between husbands and wives was light hearted yet filled with profound lessons. From Good Friday to Easter – The word “Forgiveness”



What is one word that you will like to remember on Good Friday or the Holy week?

The Christ Methodist Church Bentong congregation were given this question to think about it as they came together to remember the suffering and crucifixion of our Lord Jesus on Good Friday service. We had often taken for granted how much Jesus had suffered immensely under the hands of mankind whom He loved while on His earthly ministry. Despite that, He did not go against His Father will as plan for Him to die for all mankind. And Jesus went humbly to be crucified on the cross just as a lamb chosen to be killed for sin offering to the Almighty God.

In Luke 23: 34, we see Jesus said, **“Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing”** as He hung in agony to die. This particular Jesus’s word: **“Father, forgive them”** from the Cross was the first recorded words by Luke in addressing to God the Father. We want to remember how powerful these words spoken from the cross and what it also meant to us in this present day. During the church service, three (3) reasons were given for the need for us to discharge forgiveness in our life. First reason, we are to forgive because God forgives us. Jesus Christ died for all of our sins, without even expecting any good on our part. We are in fact so broken in this life and sinful in nature, and yet Jesus will die for us. What burden is there in us that Christ will not bear for us? That the cross cannot carry, and because of this, we have this very good reason therefore to response by forgiving others; and ourselves as He had already forgiven us.

Second reason, we are to forgive because we need forgiveness every day. The Bible teaches that we cannot receive what we are unwilling

to give; for this is the way for a new beginning in Christ. Forgiveness must be continual; flowing freely, given without expecting anything in return. It must be enjoyed and it must be employed to the meaning of our life. Unless we breath the *‘air of forgiveness’* or be forgiving, we will not be able to experience how great the love of God had in store for us.

Third reason, we are to forgive because unforgiving is real self-torture. An unforgiving attitude is self-inflicting wound on ourselves. Whenever we are resentful, unforgiving towards somebody, it always hurts us more than the person we are bitter with. Our past is already in the past, and it can’t hurt us any more unless we hold on to it. We don’t have to live in our past hurts! The reason is that Christ now carries that disappointment, that pain or hurts for us on His cross.

So, what is one word that you want to remember in this Holy week and Easter celebration? Congregation were asked to write down who they want to forgive or areas of unforgiveness and they are to paste it on the wooden cross prepared for the them. Everyone wrote something on an empty paper and surrender it the Lord that day. It was a touching moment and for those who harbor unforgiveness for very long found it so relief to do so – an act to surrender all the bitterness. All the unforgiveness “pasted on the cross” were taken out to be burnt symbolizing a total surrender of all our past unforgiveness.

From here, the congregation moved forward and cherished their Easter day service because we have let go our past. The resurrected Christ now represents a promise of new day, new life and new hope by leaving behind what hold us down spiritually in the past.

Holy Week @ Wesley Penang




Here we see Rev Andrew interacting with the congregation asking a question of faith and belief. Would you give him RM100 in exchange for an angpow that he says has RM200?

Maundy Thursday saw Bro William Lim preaching from John 13:1-17 a sermon titled "Be Washed and Be Washing". He posed the question of our identity as servants or as masters and asked if we are regularly being washed by Christ and washing others feet as well. We were challenged to consider Living Inside Out: Is to not only love those we like, but also those we know will betray or hurt us. Jesus gave that example in his act of washing not just the disciples' feet, but also Judas' feet! The MSF Choral Group demonstrated that example of service as they presented a Choral Response of "For God So Loved the World" and "Let Us Break Bread Together" in response to the message, leading the congregation also to the celebration of the Lord's Supper.

Rev Andrew Lim shared the Good Friday service message based on John 19:1-16, 'Believing But Unable to Act', a reflection on Pontius Pilate's struggle with truth and right action arising from that truth. The congregation were led through Litanies of Remembrance and given space to reflect, repent, pray and confess before God and ask forgiveness. (setting by Dale Wood) before the congregation responded with the Hymn by Graham Kendrick "Come and See (We Worship at Your Feet)" and thereafter departed in prayer and silence into the darkness of night.

Good Friday Worship Service



Easter 2023 at Wesley Melaka

Maundy Thursday

Unless I wash you, you have no part of Me
- John 13:1-17

What struck me most about this sermon was that when Jesus washed the disciples' feet, Judas was still in the Upper Room. Jesus must have washed his feet knowing that this was his betrayer's feet. What humility for us to emulate! Rev. Joshua taught us 5 lessons:

1. Obedience
2. Humility
3. Love
4. Serving others
5. Collegiality (see last section)

Good Friday

A New Commandment for you and me
- John 13:31-38

A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. Love means to will for the good of others.

Easter Sunday

Rabboni! - John 20:11-16

Jesus calls us by name as He called Mary that 1st Easter morning. Although Mary addressed Jesus, "Rabboni!" which means "Teacher", Jesus is more than just a teacher. Otherwise Christianity would have just ended up as another moral philosophy. Last but not least, we are EASTER people of Light, Hope and a Future.

Easter Cross Project

The last time Wesley Melaka decorated the Easter Cross for the Sunrise Service was in 2013. At 8.30 am on Saturday morning many church members were already up, gathering Frangipani from various pre-identified sites. These were transported to the church where the cross was to be decorated starting at 10 am. Creepers and weeds served as the base layer. Tooth picks were then painstakingly inserted into the stalk of each flower before each flower was inserted into the base layer according to a pre-determined colour scheme. This was indeed a "Gotong-Royong" project judging by the happy faces in the 10-minute YouTube clip prepared by Siang Ling. Lunch was prepared by the hospitality team. The completed Easter Cross was finally erected at 2 pm and touched up at 5.30 pm.

Skit to Re-enact the Passion of Christ was very refreshing and the cross-generational involvement was very heartening. The skit was a combination of live action, pre-recorded

video and movie snippets. The choir sang “O Sacred Head Now Wounded” just before the Crucifixion and concluded the skit with “Were You There (When They Crucified My Lord?)” Great attention was paid to details, for example Simon Peter cutting off Malchus’ ear, and Simon of Cyrene compelled to help Jesus with the cross. Many hidden talents were unearthed by this production, for example 81-year old Ho Chak Foh who acted as Pontius Pilate. However, the Oscar for best actor goes to Zachary Sim who acted as Jesus and best supporting actor goes to Shawn Yap. I supposed it was not difficult for Shawn to act as a teacher of the Law, being a lawyer himself.

New Songs & Unfamiliar Hymns

For a music-lover like me, another highlight was the rendition of hymns and songs not often sung. Good Friday service started with worship leader, Ng Jui Jien, leading the congregation in worship with the hymn **“O Love Divine, What Hast Thou Done”** (UMH 287), a Charles Wesley hymn composed in 1742.

Just before the Good Friday Proclamation we sang gospel singer, Twila Paris’ 1985 composition of **“Lamb of God”**. During the skit, the choir presented **“O Sacred Head Now Wounded”** (UMH 286), translated by renowned German composer, Paul Gerhardt in 1656; and closed with **“Were You There (When They Crucified My Lord?)”** (UMH 288), a hymn

of Afro-American origin. No wonder our choir leader, Wan Sim Tung, instructed us to sing this song soulfully and to really question the congregation, “Were You There (When They Crucified My Lord?)”

The Hymn of Preparation for the Easter Sunrise service was **“Up From The Grave He Arose”** (UMH 322), a Robert Lowry (American Baptist preacher/hymn writer) 1874 composition. I could really feel the congregation singing with fervour and gusto.

Opening of the New Extension to the Tamil Methodist Church at 8.30 am. The Easter Sunrise Service did not just end with the customary Easter breakfast. TRAC President, Rev. Joshua Khong and Rev. Aaron Liu had to rush off to attend the opening of the new extension to the Tamil Methodist Church. For the past 7 weeks Tamil Methodist Church Melaka had been worshipping at the Youth Centre of Wesley Melaka. We have participated in their fund-raising projects like food sale, shared our car park and our premise without any disruption whatsoever. This reflected collegiality, one of 5 lessons taught by President on Maundy Thursday. **Collegiality** means coming together as a college of disciples. It also demonstrated the **Connectionalism** we have within the General Conference and our existence as the Body of Christ.

Praise the Lord we had a good turn out of 437 people worshipping in person for the Palm Sunday weekend and the children came to wave Palm Leaves during worship too, together with our flaggers. Pastor Andrew preached from Matt 16:13-28 on "The Messiah must suffer and be killed".

During the Holy Week itself, we had morning reflections from Monday to Friday at KMH at 6:30-7:15 am. Zoom was also made available. After the sharing by a PCT member, we were given time to meditate and reflect and then we gathered in groups of 2-3 people to share and pray together.

On Monday Leonard shared from Luke 23:32-34 and emphasised how Jesus said "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing". He also contrasted the two thieves

who were crucified with Jesus and how they responded to Jesus differently. It is never too late to acknowledge Jesus as Lord, as long as we still have breath.

On Tuesday Lai Yin shared from John 19:25-27 on The God who sees. She mentioned how Jesus showed care and concern for his mother Mary and entrusted her to John, the disciple he loved.

On Wednesday Pastor Andrew shared from Mark 15:1-39 on The Centurion. He highlighted the centurion who executed people on a daily basis and who had been with Jesus from the time of the trial to his death on the cross. He was able to observe how Jesus reacted and faced death and his conclusion when Jesus died was that he was truly the son of God.

On Thursday Philip shared from John 19:28-34. He drew our attention to the fact that even though Jesus had the power to step down from the cross but he stayed there out of obedience to God the Father and because he wanted to complete his mission to die on the cross for our sins. At the end he said "It is finished" to signify that the penalty for our sins had been repaid, the believers in Christ had been redeemed, and we have been reconciled with God.

On Friday Alan shared from Luke 23:44-46. When Jesus died on the cross, the curtain of the temple was torn signifying that we have bold access to the throne of grace through faith in Jesus, who is our High Priest.

We were also blessed to have Bishop Jeyakumar to come and preach at our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday night services. Both services were well attended and during the Good Friday service we even had to use plastic chairs as the pews were fully utilised.

Bishop Jeya preached on "The Mighty Cross" (1 Cor 1:17-31) on Maundy Thursday. God uses the apparent weakness of the cross to demonstrate His power. Jews demanded miracles and Greeks rely on human wisdom but the cross is the stumbling block for them. We too must not place our faith in Jesus only when God performs the miracles we want Him to do.

Bishop Jeya then continued with "The Victorious Cross" (Colossians 2:6-15) on Friday where we were reminded that we have everything we need in Christ. We were also reminded that we are either progressing in our spiritual walk or we are backsliding. We cannot be stagnant Christians. Many people stayed back to be prayed for after the service.

On Holy Saturday we had a half day of prayer in KMH from 7 am to 5 pm where members could drop in to pray for whatever duration they wished to. Then at the 8 pm service Pastor Andrew preached from Matthew 17:1-8 on the Glory of Jesus. We were taught about the implications of the transfiguration and how the Glory of Jesus will give us Hope, will

change our world view, and will motivate us to listen to Him. We also had baptism and transfer of membership into CGMC.

On Sunday morning we had Sunrise service in the concourse. Pastor Andrew preached from Matthew 28:1-10 on the "Four Markers for Easter Proclamation".

Later on Easter morning our lay leader Dr Gill preached from John 11:25-27, 20;11-16 on "How Great is our God. He touched on God's creation of life, the great "I Am", and Jesus, the people around Him and the events around His death and resurrection. We were reminded to celebrate Jesus Daily, to be devoted to Jesus, and to share Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. We also were blessed by the Youth choir who sang beautiful renditions of "Bless the Lord O my soul", "How Great is our God" and "How great thou Art"

Our total attendees for Easter weekend services (English) Saturday, Sunrise and Sunday was 667. Praise the Lord.

Organizational Leadership Module (OLM) Chinese

The OLM Chinese was held at Canning Garden Methodist Church in Ipoh on the 18th of March 2023.

The Board of Chinese Ministry (BCM) organized this module for the first time and was district-focused, starting with the Perak District, with a total of 25 participants from 4 churches in the district attending. The Perak District was selected as the beginning point as there are more Chinese-speaking congregations. The BCM intends to host this module in a different district next year; or to provide training at a local congregation's request.

Due to an increase in congregations and members who speak Chinese in recent years, the BCM has recognized that more people need to be trained to serve as church leaders in addition to raising up more local preachers through its Local Preacher's Licence Modules.

In light of this, the BCM believes it is important to hold the OLM Module in order to aid members in understanding the church, the organizational structure of the Methodist Church in Malaysia, the role of Chinese-speaking congregations in the Trinity Annual Conference, and the spiritual

formation needed of a leader. The following sessions were therefore facilitated by three Chinese-speaking ordained elders:

- Session 1: The Biblical Basis of the Church (Rev Yu Chiew Song)
- Session 2: The Methodist Church in Malaysia & Organizational Structure (Rev Lim Chaw Leong)
- Session 3: The Spiritual Qualities of a Leader (Rev Wong Mun Wah)
- Session 4: Handling Meetings and Decision-Making (Rev Yu Chiew Song)

Some participants have stated that this training has improved their understanding and familiarity with our own Methodist system of church government and polity – something they had previously been unaware of. We give God the glory for that and are grateful to the facilitators for leading the sessions despite their busy schedules in the ministry.

The BCM will continue enhancing its teaching methods and materials in this module in order to more effectively develop more leaders and bless the Chinese-speaking churches in TRAC.

Methodist Heritage Weekend: 27-28 May 2023

Trinity Methodist Church Penang hosted the Northern District Methodist Heritage Weekend from 27-28 May, 2023. Pastor Dato' Daniel Ho was our speaker over the 2 days. A total of 69 people were in attendance (including helpers) for the Saturday session.

Pastor Daniel delivered the following sessions on Saturday:

Session 1: Learning from John Wesley: Evangelist, Revivalist, Pastor & Organiser Par Excellence

Session 2: Translating Wesley's message, means and methods in the Methodist Church today

Pastor Daniel's lessons from Wesley's life were inspiring and impactful. Mr. Lim Lai Keat, a Penang Trinity church member, was impressed by how Wesley would wake up at 4.30am to pray, and later in life, the temptation to wake past 5.30am was considered laziness to him. Wesley also had a relentless pursuit of holiness and formed accountability groups. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, Wesley preached more than 40,000 sermons, and traveled 250,000 miles on horseback. Some of Pastor Daniel's practical lessons that Lai Keat took away was that we should keep fit if we want to serve well until we are old, to get serious with God, and to take every opportunity to share the Gospel.

Mrs Jane Khoo, another church member, felt Pastor Daniel made an important point

that work-life balance is unbiblical because it focuses on us juggling many things in life. Instead, we should have work-life integration where work, home, ministry, etc. are integrated with God and His purpose for our life. She was also impressed by Wesley's visionary model for effective ministry involving 1) Classes/bands for discipleship, 2) using Lay Preachers, 3) involving women in ministry (Wesley's own mother was an example of this). These practices were unheard of in the 1700's.

On Sunday, 28 May, Pastor Daniel preached on "Learning from Wesley: Investments that Last" where he exhorted the church to be passionate and committed to evangelism. He emphasised that evangelism cannot be limited to a program or church event, rather it must be part of our lifestyle. We evangelise through our conduct (visual evangelism), but we must also evangelise through our words (verbal evangelism). Pastor Daniel shared that John Wesley travelled tirelessly to preach, often having to change horses during his journey, bringing great impact to England as an example of Wesley's commitment. Pastor Daniel challenged the church to commit to sharing the Gospel in every opportunity God places us.

We give thanks to the Lord for the impactful sessions and preaching over the Methodist Heritage Weekend.

Methodist Archives Seminar 2023

The Methodist Church in Malaysia (MCM) hosted the in-person Methodist Archives Seminar 2023 on 6-7 May 2023 in Trinity Methodist Church, Petaling Jaya with the assistance from the TRAC Board of Archives and History.

In his introduction, Pr Robert Khaw encouraged participants saying: “We will never know what we archive today may have a big impact on the work and the people of God in the future.” This was the case with what was found in the archives in Babylon, which had a huge implication on the temple project and God’s people (Ezra 6:1-22).

Thereafter, our Bishop Dr T Jeyakumar was invited to share his thoughts pertaining to the MCM Archives Seminar. He encouraged all present in this vital work of archives and history in our churches. He then prayed for the MCM churches and a fruitful seminar.

Participants came from TRAC, TAC and SIAC churches, and also from a Presbyterian church. Altogether, there were more than 50 attendees present, including Bishop, speakers and organising team members. They came from the length and breadth of the country.

Our two guest speakers were very knowledgeable, and their presentations were most engaging and instructive:

† “Ministry of History” by Dr Tai Kim Teng, who enlightened participants saying: “History opens our eyes to the obedience of past heroes and heroines that stretches their faith and ours.” He also forewarned us that “a generation that ignores their history has no past, and probably has no future as well.”

Dr Tai also shared on the “Responsibilities of Church Historian”, stressing four essential attributes of a church historian, i.e. calling, character, capability and commitment.

† “Oral History” by Dr Tan Miao Ing, who offered two reasons why church oral history is important. Firstly, it allows people to use their own words to capture aspects of their faith, testimonies, and experiences that may not be recorded in writing. Secondly, it is a valuable tool for capturing and preserving information about historical events, major developments in the church – lives of individual members, testimonies, and memories that may otherwise be lost.

It has also been said by some quarters that “the collection of oral history is always most urgent because we are dealing with a frail historical source – people die.” Further, “there is every reason to treat oral history seriously to help us in understanding our past if that oral history is conscientiously gathered, well-documented, and critically evaluated.”

Members of TRAC Board of Archives and History also shared during the seminar as follows:

- † “Survey of Churches’ Records” by Ms Aileen Khoo, who gave invaluable tips on, inter alia, what to keep and what to toss regarding church records, apart from arranging for a practical session on caring for our church records.
- † “How to Set-up Archives Online?” by Mr Jason Yap, who helped participants to understand about digital archives, including choosing the right digital archives plan.
- † “Promotional Ideas on Celebrating Church Anniversary” by Mrs Goh Phing Choo, who shared her invaluable experience on archiving, as well as organised the exhibition of books and anniversary souvenirs.

“Always be able to remember these things for generations to come!”

Retelling our history is important. It is this memory that sustained the people of Israel. It told them who they were, where they came from and where they were going. We are historical beings. If we are to know God’s saving grace at all, we must experience it in our history. The recitation of salvation history does not merely help us remember “back when”. The story powerfully influences us here and now. It tells us, just as it told the Israelites ... God delivered us from slavery ... God guided us through the terrible wilderness ... God prepared us for the land of promise.

It is for this reason that the Methodist Church in Malaysia, with the assistance of TRAC Board of Archives and History, embarked on this initiative to help our MCM churches preserve their records, so that we may continue to learn from our past and anticipate our future with the help of God.


Rev. Ng Ee Lin (11/01/1935 – 11/12/2022)

Rev. Ng Ee Lin served the Lord faithfully in Malaya Annual Conference (MAC), Singapore-Malaya Annual Conference (SMAC) and Trinity Annual Conference (TRAC) from 1957 to 2000. He served as pastor to several churches in Malaysia and Singapore before settling down in Petaling Jaya and serving the Lord between 1973 to 2000 at Trinity Methodist Church. This record will never likely be broken. During this tenure, he was also District Superintendent of Selangor District (1973 – 1974 & 1978 – 1979), the Eastern District (1979 – 1980, 1988, 1993) and the Northern District (1994). The pinnacle of his leadership in TRAC was being the President of TRAC (1989 – 1996).

I was privileged to begin to serve the Lord in TRAC when he was the President. Although his face seemed serious and stern to me as a young pastor, I soon got to see a man who loved to share jokes and was ever willing to help me with useful advice in pastoral ministry as a Senior Minister and President of the Annual Conference.

I will never forget him asking me this question at my entrance interview into TRAC as he knew that I was already engaged to Jane in 1992. He asked: Will your future wife be supportive of your ministry as a pastor? I answered: Yes.



Thirty years later, I can testify that Jane has been very supportive in God's ministry and as my wife.

Rev. Ng Ee Lin knew the Book of Discipline very well. I remember Rev. Hwa Chien who took over from him as TRAC President used to frequently get his advice of matters pertaining to the Book of Discipline.

We offer our tribute to Rev. Ng Ee Lin and remember him as a faithful and dedicated servant of the Lord. Many retired pastors and currently serving pastors of TRAC attended his funeral service at Trinity Methodist Church, Petaling Jaya. It was indeed a fitting place for us to bid our final farewell to him.



Flood Relief
