

Easter Message 2022

Easter Greetings to you and your family.

Soar we now where Christ has led, Alleluia!
Following our exalted Head, Alleluia!
Made like Him, like Him we rise, Alleluia!
Ours the cross, the grave, the skies, Alleluia!

Charles Wesley's *Christ the Lord is Risen Today* is sung in many of our churches at Easter Service. It is one of my favourite hymns and a very familiar one which I have sung as a young boy in church on many Easter Sundays. The words in the above stanza spoke deeply to me.

And I pray that these words which had resounded with might and power in Methodist worship for 283 years continue to bless and inspire us in our walk with Christ our Risen Lord, our Redeemer King.

1. SOAR WE NOW WHERE CHRIST HAS LED

We praise God that there is a growing number of worshippers returning to in-person worship. Most of the churches I visited have seen an increase with their in-person worship service. I praise and thank God for your courage, faithfulness and obedience. Well done, brothers and sisters. All who are healthy, able-bodied and well-disposed are showing the way for the transition to the new normal. As the dust of the pandemic settles, I believe we will see a revival and rise in our church attendance.

God has been working in our midst for the past two years during the many pandemic lockdowns. Many TRAC churches reported this, "Brothers and sisters who had been away from church returned to online worship, joining our online services, small groups and other ministry. Jesus in His love has drawn them back to the Father. God has brought them back to the church; therefore, let us join our Lord in the work He has started, let us soar with Christ, where He has led. Returning to church in the new normal, let us continue to invite brothers and sisters, and friends to join us in church.

Brothers and sisters, I exhort you to arise with zeal and courage, to soar with Christ as He leads. I want to thank our sisters in TRAC MW for catching this vision. Our sisters chose the theme, Soaring with God, for MW.

2. FOLLOWING OUR EXALTED HEAD

Following our exalted Head, Jesus Christ, who goes about His Father's business. Jesus during His earthly ministry, modelled for us the example of going about His Father's business attending to God's Kingdom work...with faith, obedience, courage and zeal. And God exalted Him.

*Therefore, God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. **Philippians 2: 9-11***

Brothers and sister let us follow the example that our Risen Lord had shown us. Christ, the exalted Head, shows us the way, prepares us for Kingdom work with faith, obedience, courage and zeal.

3. MADE LIKE HIM, LIKE HIM WE RISE

Wesley's hymns hold the proper balance of theology and personal experience. Both John and Charles Wesley have their spiritual awakening; Charles on the 21st May 1738 and John Wesley on 24th May 1738. Wesley's hymns invite us to express and articulate our faith and personal experience as God's children, maturing and growing in stature, attaining the whole measure of the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4:13).

Growing in perfect love, in Christian perfection...Made like Him, like Him we rise. Yes, brothers and sisters, in holiness we live our lives in God's perfect image through His Son Jesus Christ. We teach this in our churches, we model it in our lives, we imprint and pass it on to our children and children's children.

John Wesley wrote to one of his preachers, "Where Christian perfection is not strongly and explicitly preached, there is seldom any remarkable blessing from God; and consequently, little addition to the society, and little life in the members of it.

(Wesley on Perfection, compiled by J.A. Wood, Section XVII)

Wesley's instructions on Christian Perfection continue to inspire us to make an impact and to leave godly imprint in society and in the life of the church...that others are persuaded to pursue Christian perfection too.

Brothers and sisters, this is my exhortation for you. We must never forget that we are made like Him, and we are destined to rise like Him. Therefore, let us pursue Christian perfection brothers and sisters. And by the power of Christ's resurrection, we go forth in God's anointing and blessings to impact and influence the world around us for the glory and majesty of our Risen Saviour, Jesus Christ.

4. OURS THE CROSS, THE GRAVE, THE SKIES

Brothers and sisters, Jesus said this to His disciples then, He is saying this to us now.

Then Jesus said to His disciples, "*Whoever wants to be My disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow Me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for Me will find it.*"

Matthew 16:24-25

- i) Ours the cross. Yes, must take up our cross, and deny ourselves, brothers and sisters.

What does it mean to deny ourselves? The answer is in v.25.

Denying ourselves is forsaking or disowning ourselves.

Are we willing to forsake ourselves? Will you disown yourself?

Are we willing to take up the cross and follow Jesus?

I believe for us it is a resounding, **“Yes, Lord. We are.”**

- ii) The grave is the symbol of death.

Our old self is dead. We arise in the Risen Christ, a new creation in Christ. And for God's redeemed, the grave is empty and death has lost its sting.

“Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?” The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians 15: 55-57

- iii) What about the skies? The skies is a reminder for us that the Resurrected Christ is coming back again. He who called us to soar with Him and to follow Him, will come back for us. Amen.

*For the Lord Himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. **1 Thessalonians 4: 16***

This Easter marks a new beginning for us. As we emerge from pandemic lockdowns and the many challenges transitioning into the new normal the nation is embracing, we look forward to serving God, Church and community in new ways in God leading.

Brothers and sisters, together we can do it. Come, let us join our hearts, our hands, together. We go forth with faith, obedience, courage and zeal...we soar with Christ as He leads.




Renewed Through Prayer

We praise God for the recently-concluded Methodist Prayer Convention (20-22/5/22).

This was the fifth in a series of MPC held once in every 4 years, toggling between Peninsular Malaysia and East Malaysia. For the first time, this year’s MPC was organised in a hybrid mode.



Participants had the options of joining MPC either via church-organised hubs (in-person or Zoom) or YouTube. It was encouraging to hear of self-organised hubs at the Cell Group level too.

There was a good reason to encourage in-person hubs. In the words of our TRAC Bishop Joshua Khong: “This is an excellent opportunity to encourage and promote in-person worship and participation. We set up the church for our congregation to join via YouTube where we can participate together in-person.”

All our 6 Districts organised the hubs, totaling 11 hubs in English, Bahasa Malaysia and Mandarin. In-person hub attendance ranged between 142 to 270 participants for the 5 MPC sessions.



There was flexibility within structure in the way the prayer sessions were organised. Not just hubs but individuals too joined in prayers led by intercessors in the main MPC Zoom. Others organised themselves in small groups to pray through the Annual Conferences' prayer items. Still others chose to pray with different prayer leaders stepping forward to intercede as they were led by the Holy Spirit.



Whatever the prayer pathways might be, the one important thing was that multitude came in one spirit to worship and pray earnestly for the church, the nation and the world.

Trinity Methodist Church, Petaling Jaya was privileged to have our MCM Bishop Dr T. Jeyakumar joined the in-person hub on the first night, together with TRAC Bishop Joshua Khong and the Pastor-in-Charge, Rev Paul Christie and their spouses.

Our hearts were stirred up by the Holy Spirit that night when Bishop Jeyakumar prayed thus:

***Dear God,
We are desperately in need of renewal in our church. Please look mercifully at our Methodist Church. Holy Spirit, descend upon us. Make us what You want us to be. Empower Your church. Revive us, O Lord! May we be people with repentant hearts. May our church be a mighty witness in our nation. May the church not fail. Baptise us with the Holy Spirit! In Jesus' Name, Amen.***

Truly, TRAC churches, together with fellow churches in the Annual Conferences, were united in oneness of heart before our Almighty and Loving God in prayer, who hears the prayer of His people.

“Hearer of prayer, to Thee all flesh cometh.” (Psalm 65:2; YLT)

Now, even before the MPC started, the call to pray had gone out to TRAC churches, indeed all churches in the Annual Conferences. “Every day, pray for MPC” was the clarion call by Bishop Dr T. Jeyakumar. Many prayers rose heavenward like incense to God (Ps 141:2; cf Rev 5:8) as churches organised corporate prayers. Cell groups prayed. Families and individuals prayed. Praise God for the concert of prayers.

How apt then was the chosen theme for this year's MPC - "Renewed through Prayer"!

Thank God for the partnership in the gospel with bro. Asiri Fernando's (first MPC speaker), and for his heartfelt prayers on Aldersgate Sunday for the Methodist church.

Thank God too for God's servant, Rev Dr David Doong (second MPC speaker), who ministered the Word from Lamentations 5:21 to us saying: "To the Methodist Church, let us return to the call of mission, i.e. make disciples of all nations. This is the core value of our Lord Jesus' commission. The Church will go through a renewal. The future glory will be greater than the past glory because our God is a God of new things!" (Hag 2:9; Isa 43:18-19)

And what a needful and timely prayer it was for Rev Dr David to intercede for our Methodist church:

"You are a God who accomplishes new things. Bless us Lord, and may our church be a blessing to all people of all nations. Help us not to be a self-preserving church, but a church with a mission to reach out to all."

All God's people responded with a resounding "Amen" in the hubs, Zoom and homes throughout the land. Hallelujah!

It has been said that the conclusion of a speech matters. Similarly, the concluding remarks of this Prayer Convention. So, let us remember, i.e. not only recall but also pay attention to, the passionate urgings of our Bishop Jeyakumar.

I want to see a prayer movement rise in our midst. That is why we chose, 'Renewed through Prayer' as the theme of our Prayer Convention based on Lamentations 5:21. This verse on renewal is about the conversion of the hearts and the transformation of the lives of the people.

What we need to see next is a prayer movement. The way to do this is to "never stop praying" (1 Thess 5:17; NLT). Don't give up praying. We cannot live a Christian life without prayer.

Prayer can draw us back to a right relationship with God. Prayer can prevent us from backsliding. Keep on praying to stop corruption and greed. Keep on praying for good governance in the

country. Keep on praying for holy living and a renewed church. Keep on praying, totally relying on God. Don't give up praying. Don't get tired of praying.

Take prayer seriously. Get our people to join in prayer. Join the once-a-month MCM prayer gathering. Whichever group you are in, pray. Don't neglect prayer.

Don't forget this - the impetus to pray is always by the Holy Spirit. The flesh will never think of prayer. Whenever you discern the Holy Spirit has started a prayer gathering, join in. Most importantly, don't neglect your church prayer meetings.

We see all over evil and disaster have increased. We need to pray more. We would then raise a prayer movement - a regular time of prayer in our individual lives, home and wherever else.

Finally, as we end MPC now, it doesn't mean we are ending prayer. Prayer must continue.

TRAC Participants at MPC Share Their Takeaway

Bro Jimmy Phua (WMC, Kuantan)

Very good MPC. Triple thumbs up! Well-organised and good speakers. Mr Asiri and Rev Dr David Doong are anointed speakers. First time listening to them, but I can see their passion for Christ and the work of God's Kingdom. MPC being hybrid also helped to reach out to more Methodists and friends. No need to travel far, yet for those who prefer the in-person participation and fellowship, they can also opt for it. I would encourage such a hybrid platform in future. Many couldn't attend previous MPC due to travel distance, and the need to take leave from work. Also, I take my hats off to the tech team. I believe a lot of hardwork were put into the tech preparation. Blessed be the Name of God!

Sis Lee Sok Yan (Subang Methodist Church)

“Let the morning Bible study or devotion inform my intercession. Pray what I have learned from the Bible for people.” For me, the morning devotion is a precious personal time for communion with God. It still is – but I need to regularly include this aspect that Mr Asiri Fernando mentioned in his talk in Session 1 of MPC 2022.

Sis Thong Swee Mun (Trinity Methodist Church, PJ)

I thank and praise God for the MPC! My takeaway from bro Asiri’s message is “meet people at their highest”. Very often, I have difficulty engaging people, especially youth or younger people. I learnt the importance of placing them above me, and lowering myself and ask them for help. I was reminded of our Lord Jesus’ example in asking the Samaritan woman at the well for a drink. I need to put others above myself and honour others. I thank God for challenging me to pray that God bends me, i.e. lower myself to have the mind of Christ, and understand what humility means. I need to be mindful that Jesus being God made himself nothing taking the very nature of a servant (Phil 2:3-11).

Bro Yap Choon Hong (WMC, Johor Bahru)

At first, it just felt like any other prayer meetings. There were the usual feelings of anxiety about praying in front of people, the worries about not praying the right thing or in the right way, the awkwardness that came from wondering whether it would make any difference, especially when it felt so uninspired. Then as we went along, a realisation came to me – the thought that all of us were praying at the same time on the same things. On the surface, there didn’t seem to be anything extraordinary about that thought. However, the thought remained, and it gradually became something else. It became a sense of connectedness, which although abstract yet felt comforting. Looking in deeper, I had a fleeting glimpse of the underlying reality that was yet untouched by the anxieties and awkwardness and all the other emotions swirling around in me. The reality was that we were all praying in one spirit, despite how it might look from the outside. Though fleeting, I felt strangely comforted after that, and I settled down to just praying. The sense of connectedness is what resonated with me.

Rev Choy Quin (WMC Johor Bahru)

I sense the warmth of all who joined to come together as a family to pray. The timely message to remind us that we need one another as we live for God to further his kingdom on earth.

An Ecumenical Easter Celebration

On the morning of May 5th, 2022, the Bishops, pastors and elders from various churches gathered at the Church of Assumption, Petaling Jaya, for an Ecumenical Easter Celebration.

The purpose of this gathering was to encourage collaboration amongst our fellow Christians at grassroots level. Praise God for the Assumption Parish Ministry of Ecumenical and Inter-religious Affairs!

Immediately after a welcome address by Fr Leonard Lexon, a choir began to fill the little hall with songs of praise and worship. Anyone standing in this hall would have been enveloped in the resounding voices of the many shepherds God has appointed.

Representing TRAC, Bishop Joshua Khong preached on the topic of "One Spirit, One Body", based on 1 Corinthians 12: 12-14, which had earlier been read aloud by Rev. Paul Christie.

Then the leaders, representing the Anglican, Brethren, Evangelical, Lutheran and Methodist churches in Petaling Jaya, took turns to lead in a series of intercessory prayers. We prayed for:

- the needs of the universal church
- the public authorities, and salvation of the world

- people who have no one to turn to
- people burdened by difficulties
- the local community of faith represented by the assembly
- broken families
- people still seeking the Lord

Following the prayer session, everyone lit a candle and placed it on a table. The table was eventually covered with little flames. This is a symbolic act of One Body in Christ, renewing our pledge to obey Christ's call to be the light of the world, empowered by One Spirit.

The Light of our risen Christ will never be hidden. To remind us of this, each one received a little gift - a battery-operated candle. Turning on our candles, we, once again, became a choir, each voice declaring "This Little Light of Mine, I'm Gonna Let It Shine"!

The service, which started at 11 am, came to an end at 1 pm.

We finally switched off the battery-operated candles in our hands. Yet, not a single candle inside us will be turned off. Together, we have spurred one another to burn brighter for our risen Lord and Saviour - Jesus Christ!



Reflections at Easter 2022

Learning from Jesus – MAUNDY THURSDAY HOLY COMMUNION SERVICE

Attendance : 99

Preacher : Pastor Danny Chiew

Scripture Passages : John 13:1-17

The mugginess of Maundy Thursday sure was a reflection of the solemnness of the occasion. Accordingly, I noticed many of the congregants wore dark coloured clothing. Even with the air conditioner on and all the side doors to the sanctuary opened, many of us must have felt sweaty reminding us of how Jesus sweated in the Garden of Gethsemane. The farewell message of anyone is usually profound and the Bible has no shortage of farewell messages, from Moses in Deuteronomy 31 to 33 and Joshua 23, 24 to Paul's address to the Ephesian elders in Acts 20. John 13:1-17 can be considered a farewell message from Jesus. Besides The Last Supper there was also the object lesson of feet-washing for us to follow. "Does your church practise feet-washing?" This question was posed to me by a patient of mine who belonged to the True Jesus Church as she proudly announced that in her church, feet-washing is a sacrament. While I disagreed with her, I am nevertheless reminded of the broader meaning of feet-washing. What can we learn from John 13:1-17?

1. The Highest Taking the Lowest

In John 13:3 Jesus knew where He came from and yet He did a chore that is normally done by the lowest servant, a Gentile slave. C. S. Lewis once said, "Humility is not thinking less of yourself but thinking of yourself less." Humility and Love was the hallmark of Jesus. Without humility love is impossible.

2. Missing the point in the midst of action and distraction

We should not be like Peter. We need to think before we act, think before we say and see things from God's perspective. Jesus reminds us in John 13:10a that once a man is washed, he is already cleansed. But as we fall again and again in our Christian walk, "We all need some kind of cleansing (of our soul) along the way."

3. Judas pretended to be clean

Judas moved among the disciples but his heart has been turned. Have our hearts been turned too?

4. Jesus and The Mandate

Maundy is from the Latin word *mandatum* which means Mandate or Command. Pastor Danny challenged us to ask ourselves, "Who is Jesus to us?" "What is His title?" Jesus effectively told us to be a slave (feet-washing) by serving one another. He then commanded us to love one another as He has loved us. James 1:22 says, "Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what the Word says." A follower or disciple of Jesus is not just someone who believes in Him, but someone who follows Him, and does what the Master wants him to do. John 13:17 (NIV) tells us, "Now that you know these things, you will be **blesed** if you do them." **Blesed** means happy. So, we need to serve happily in obedience to Christ.

Present at the Cross - GOOD FRIDAY SERVICE
Attendance : 141
Preacher : Pastor Aaron Liu
Scripture Lesson : John 19:1-37

This sermon had an immediate impact from the time the Scriptures were read when scenes from Mel Gibson's *The Passion of The Christ* were used as the backdrop to the PowerPoint slides of the relevant Scripture Passages. Pastor Aaron then introduced the sermon with his rendition of Johnny Cash's 1992 *Were You There (When They Crucified My Lord)*. This was then followed by 6 reflections each with an ensuing 30 seconds pause.

Reflection 1: Pontius Pilate

Are we like Pontius Pilate who knew that Jesus is The Truth and yet caved in to the crowd?

Reflection 2: Peter & The Disciples

Are we like Peter and the disciples who despite having lived with Jesus for 3 years, seeing the miracles He had performed, listened to His wise teachings and yet at the crucial moment, abandoned and what's worse, deny Him?

Reflection 3: Judas & The Soldiers

Are we like Judas and the soldiers who because of greed and materialism, betrayed and carelessly gambled for Jesus' clothing respectively?

Reflection 4: Chief Priest & Pharisees

Are we like the Chief Priest & Pharisees standing tall and proud with our religiosity and traditions, pronouncing do's and don'ts, wanting Jesus to fit our mould, having a form of godliness but denying its power, twisting the Word of God in order to fit God into our image?

For the above 4 reflections, the congregational response was, "Father, forgive us, for we know not what we do."

Reflection 5: Mary, The Mother of Jesus, The Women & John

Are we like them who have experienced the reality of Jesus and our lives transformed, but now are in grief, despair and hopelessness seeing the state of the world?

The congregation response for reflection 5 was, "Surely, Jesus took up our pain and bore our suffering."

Reflection 6: Centurion Guard

Are we an outsider looking in who saw Jesus healed Malchus' ear, heard Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" and who later exclaimed as in Mark 15:39b (NIV), "Surely this Man was the Son of God"?

For reflection 6, Pastor Aaron led us (and any outsiders) in a prayer of repentance. He concluded the sermon by reminding us that we were all there when Jesus was crucified.



CHRIST OUR EVERLASTING HOPE - EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE

Scripture Lesson: John 20:1-18

“Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark,” a full moon in a cloudless sky greeted my wife and I as we drove to church to attend the Easter Sunrise Service. It was as if God has chased away the clouds and a new day is dawning, good weather allowing us to worship our Risen Lord outdoor.

Speaking about The Resurrection and a new life in Christ, Easter Sunrise Service 2022 was special because there were 3 infant baptism. Together with reception into membership of a couple in their Golden Years, it reflected the all-encompassing love of Christ.

Thanks be to technology, the Easter Sunrise Service was live-streamed to homes and recorded for future viewing which has been the norm since the beginning of the Covid pandemic. Yet among the 3 sets of sophisticated audio-visual equipment, PowerPoint slides were conspicuously absent, reminding me that in the sharing of God’s Word, we should depend more on His Spirit than on technology. Have we come to expect

and depend on PowerPoint slides more than the unction of God? Do we place our hope on things and not God?

To answer this question, Pastor Lee Yng’s sermon on **CHRIST OUR EVERLASTING HOPE** was timely. In her sharing she put forward 4 points:

1. We have hope that is beyond rationality but not irrational.
2. We have hope that God is doing a new thing.
3. We have hope that everything wrong with the world will be made right.
4. We have hope that life is worth living.

*“Because He lives, I can face tomorrow;
because He lives, all fear is gone;
because I know He holds the future,
and life is worth the living
just because He lives.”*

We praise God that after two years of pandemic, the church family was able to celebrate Good Friday and Easter Sunday physically and online as we transition to the endemic stage.

The reflections call us to respond in surrender and worship to God in Christ who demonstrated His passionate love and commitment to us through His vicarious sacrifice, deliverance and victory over sin on the cross. We not



For Good Friday service, we had the children and young adults working together to share three (3) reflections. SSMC is an inter-generational church therefore, we intentionally involve and engage the generations to worship and serve together. Each reflection began with a child reading a passage followed by an adult sharing a short reflection on the last week of Jesus' ministry, beginning with The last supper and Jesus washing the disciples' feet (John 13:1-6), Gethsemane "Oil Press" (Mat 26:36-45) and It is finished (tete, lestai) (John 19:17-20; 28-30) about Servanthood, Obedience and Victory. These great truths are so well known and too familiar to many of us. It is so possible for us, the church, to lose her first love and still continue business as usual, having a form of religion but denying its power and reality. When the extraordinary becomes ordinary, the priceless becomes cheap, the sacred becomes rituals, the heartfelt experience becomes cognitive information and relationship with God becomes religion, we have to take action. Familiarity sets in because of careless neglect in developing a vibrant relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ or from the callousness

only accept and believe in Christ, but must embrace servanthood, obedience and the way of the Cross. The three (3) reflections ended with this challenge, **'Don't just believe in Jesus but believe like Jesus!'**

Between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, the worship and prayer ministry organised a twenty four (24) hour **Behold the Lamb** worship and prayer beginning 6.00 am Saturday to 6.00 am on Resurrection Sunday. Thirty (30) minutes slots were allocated. The small home groups (English and Bahasa), children from the Worship and Prayer Altar (WPA) English and Bahasa groups, and individuals excitedly signed up and participated. It was a joy to see members taking ownership to plan and delegate responsibilities to members to lead in worship and prayer. They were instructed to seek God on the flow and direction. Praise God all forty-eight (48) thirty minutes slots were all taken up though there was the initial concern about filling up all slots. The inspiration came to the organising group who felt the Holy Spirit wanted SSMC family to spend time to gaze and be in the presence



of the Lamb of God who is also called the Lion of Judah. It reminded us that God is working out His glorious plan in the seemingly silence and non-activity of the Saturday. It spoke about living, worshipping and serving from a place of rest and beholding Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith. The Holy Spirit directed the focus and flow of the different groups weaving it together. There was continuous praise and worship, inter-mingled with supplications and requests for country, church and family salvation. The Holy Spirit moved and spoke followed by intense and deep repentance in the early morning hours on Sunday. It was indeed a refreshing time for us. The core group is waiting upon the Lord for the next worship and prayer assembly.

Praise God on Easter Sunday we had the largest in person (238) and online (160 devices logged on) service attendance since the pandemic. The message **'What If'** from 1 Cor 15 :3-8; 13-19 was shared by Rev Dr Ng Swee Ming. If there is no resurrection, our faith is in vain, our hope is gone, sin remains and those who died in Christ perished. Hallelujah! Jesus did rise from the dead. Our faith is sure. We have a living hope. We are forgiven, redeemed and will receive our full inheritance at our resurrection or when He comes. The Holy Spirit touched different ones who came forward for ministry. Those online were also prayed for. The celebrative worship ended with the song Jesus is alive! To God be the glory !

Wesley Raub planned to have a Sunrise Easter Worship Service. The residents of Haknook Jenang are now part of the congregation of Wesley Raub. The evening before, the worship leaders prepared residents of Haknook Jenang for the worship. What does the Resurrection of Jesus Mean to Me?

Since 2001, Easter has been extra special and meaningful for me. Both my husband and mother were baptized on the same day on Easter Sunday. My dear mother accepted Jesus as her personal Saviour when she was in her seventies. An illiterate woman, her simple faith reminds me of what Jesus said ‘I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven’ (Mat 18:3). After experiencing the goodness of God in her life she wanted my father to experience it too. To my mum’s dismay my father kept delaying making a decision for the Lord. Despite that she never ever gave up on him reminding me of how Jesus who never gives up on us too.

A few years later, my mum suffered a stroke and was in a coma for three days. After three days she miraculously woke up and fully recovered almost immediately. When my pastor at that time, Pastor Thomas Chin visited her she told him that it’s not her time to meet the Lord yet because she has an important mission on Earth that she had to accomplish. Being an illiterate woman we were all amazed at what she told us. Her motto is ‘Never Give Up!’

Allow me to bring us back to when my mother told me one day that she wanted to accept Jesus into her life. I was at that time worshipping in Christ Methodist Church, Bentong and the ladies’ group used to gather every week for worship, bible study and prayers. We prayed for my parents to be saved but deep in my heart I had doubts about my parents’ salvation. Never in my wildest imagination that God really answered my prayer! Prayer is indeed powerful. You never know when God is going to answer your prayer. I was amazed and in shock. How could I lead my mum to pray the sinner’s prayer in the hakka dialect? My first thought went to my dear friend, Helen Liew who is from the Chinese Methodist Church. As soon as she heard my predicament she came to my mum’s house immediately. Being a Hokkien herself and with her broken Hakka she tried very hard to explain the good news to my mum and my mum kept nodding her head to say that she understood the message. Helen then led my mum to Christ in Hakka. We actually had a good laugh at the broken Hakka after everything was over. A soul was saved on this day. Hallelujah! The broken Hakka also reminds me of how Jesus’ body was broken so that our souls can be saved!

Helen never failed to send my mum to church every Sunday. After her stroke I began to wonder how she was going to accomplish her important mission on Earth. Every Sunday after service, she will gather some leaflets from the church and asked my father to read for her. Her illiteracy actually is to her advantage because my father being the kind and loving husband would diligently read the leaflets and at the same time he too got to learn more about our Lord indirectly. What a brilliant idea! Despite this my father kept postponing his decision to commit his life to God. He kept telling my mum it's not the right time yet.

One day in January 2001, my mum who looked healthy told me that she will meet Jesus in heaven that particular year. Of course I brushed it aside and told her it was something for the Lord to decide and I also reminded her of her mission that she had to accomplish. She even told me to prepare myself and not be sad when she's gone. Did she make a pact with her Lord? She was all ready to die to be with her Father in heaven, just like Jesus who was all ready to die for us so that we can all be with our Father in heaven eternally.

Sure enough in April 2001, my mum suffered another stroke which needed an immediate brain surgery. After the surgery she was conscious but not able to speak. She could still hear and open or shut her eyes and nodded or shook her head. But her mission was not accomplished yet so how could she just leave like that? Just like Jesus who never gives up on us, she too never gave up on my father. On her deathbed, using whatever limited means of communication she still had, she miraculously convinced my father to accept Jesus as his personal Saviour. Hallelujah! My mum's mission was finally accomplished! This happened on 13 April 2001 and it was Good Friday reminding me on why Jesus died for my father on the Cross so that his sins can be forgiven. I couldn't thank God enough on this special day. I couldn't control myself and had to rush to the toilet to cry my eyes out - tears

of pure happiness and joy! My mum who was 82 then after accomplishing her mission, just closed her eyes and on the third day went peacefully to be with her Lord on 15 April 2001 on Easter Sunday! The Lord must have loved her so much that He chose this auspicious day to bring her to her eternal home.

I shared this story in my eulogy to my dear mum only to find that there was not a dry eye among her church friends. I will continue to tell of this amazing love story to everyone who is willing to listen so as to encourage us all that love is the most important tool to bring others to the Lord. Praise the Lord that I've finally plucked up enough courage sharing my mum's story here after much encouragement from Pastor Ting. Many years ago Bishop Emeritus Ong Hwai Teik also encouraged me to share my story after hearing it from me but I was not ready then.

Christ's resurrection means for me -

1. I fear not death for death has lost its sting when Jesus rose from the dead. I too will be resurrected one day together with all who believe in Him will be reunited in heaven eternally.
2. God, my Comforter, will never stop loving me and He never gives up on me - always patient, always kind and always forgiving.
3. I serve a Living God who arose from the dead, a God whom I can talk to and communicate and whom I can call Abba, my Father.
4. I am confident that I will live eternally in heaven after my life here on earth is done, unlike other non-believers who are not sure of a place in heaven.

I believe Jesus did not die in vain on the Cross. His resurrection will continue to give us hope that all will believe and have an everlasting life even though we die - John 11:25.

OLM PLUS Northern District

26th Feb and 12th March 2022

OLM, an acronym that may not be familiar for the younger TRAC Churches' members of today. OLM stands for "**Organizational Leadership Module**," and its original intention was to inform the leadership of how things were structured in the Methodist church, particularly, the TRAC churches and how these entities relate with each other. (e.g. LCEC, PPRC, Committees, Organizations, Etc.)

Hence, the "what" and "how" descriptions and explanations were laboriously listed in the first OLM training. This distilling of the information contained in the Methodist Book of Discipline helps the leadership (especially the newly elected ones) to work more efficiently and effectively by minimizing potential overlaps or misunderstandings.

OLM PLUS however, seems to be seeking out the spirit behind these structures in which we, the church is to operate in. OLM PLUS was divided into four sessions conducted via zoom on two different Saturdays. Bishop Joshua Khong and Rev. Ronald Yap had led two sessions each. Indeed, it is a timely and needed complimentary workshops for the church.

The Northern District had a total of 76 names registered from 6 churches for OLM PLUS.

Key Takeaways from the sessions:

26th FEB 2022

Speaker: Bishop Joshua Khong

Session One: SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP - LEADING WITH GOD'S AGENDA

Bishop Joshua started off by getting the leadership to think about spirituality in the Church. Quick reviews on topics such as Spiritual Leadership, Spiritual Community, Measuring Spirituality, Toxic leadership and many more were discussed. These reminded the attendees of the importance of the spiritual aspects of the church. Another interesting discussion was on the difference of being just "spiritual" instead of having "Christian spirituality with discipline" in living out our beliefs. It was mentioned that "One can be "spiritual," which is, a rising trend but void of "Christian Discipline" which is an antithesis of orthodox Christianity." The above sparked many lively discussions and questions amongst the participants.

Session Two: SPIRITUAL LEGACY - WHAT LEGACY ARE WE LEAVING BEHIND?

In this particular session, our Bishop Joshua, took us through an endearing journey of his own spiritual growth. He tells of an account of which his spiritual parent, a certain Auntie Winnie and how she had influenced Bishop Joshua's faith. A touching testimony of how one need not be "spectacular" in their Christian life to leave behind a Christian legacy. I believe each participant were challenged to look at our own journey and the journeys we are embarked on with others more carefully. Priorities, I believe were realigned once again for the Glory of God. The session ends with a call to prioritize and carefully look at how we as a church is "parenting" the next generation of believers.

Session Three: SPIRITUAL COMMUNITY - CULTIVATING A LEADERSHIP COMMUNITY

Rev. Ronald started off the session with a quick survey on “what kind of spiritual leadership” we, as a church longs for. The results were presented via an interesting online tool, it captured the responses in a creative and eye-catching manner. Rev Ronald then moved us to think about “Relational Spirituality” in discussions about leadership being a body of community rather than stopping at just a committee which ends with task(s) done. Deeper conversations on the features of “community” vs. “committee” ensued

Session Four: SPIRITUAL CONVERSATION - FOSTERING HEALTHY DIALOGUES AND CONVERSATIONS

In the last session, Rev. Ronald implored the participants to rethink how we communicate as Christians. Discussions on how a “spiritual conversation” looks like were explored in detail. Breakout sessions to reinforce the thinking and processing of these truths were done. Aspect of active listening and skills to dialogue well was encouraged. Aside from that, the need to have spiritual conversations that move all participants from defending past positions to generative ideas that are aligned to God’s will, was another reminder. The church is challenged once more to look at how we can have good spiritual dialogues with each other to ultimately bring Glory to GOD.

Some of the comments and feedbacks from the participants on these sessions:

“Remind the LCEC we are a family. Listen to each other.”

“I need to seek and discern God’s will, rather than to promote my own agenda.”


“Support the church leaders and pastors. Pray and encourage our members to be in leadership and ministries especially the younger ones.”

“Relationships first.”

“Timely and urgent clarion call of new leadership for the church. Existing leaders must deliberate the call with love.”

Probationary Ministers Retreat 2022






Rev Bah War A/L Bah Rantau, Elder yang bersara dari Persidangan Misi Sengoi Methodist, telah kembali ke pangkuan Tuhan pada tengahari Ahad 13 Februari 2022 di Kampung Ulu Bekor, Balang Manong, Kuala Kangsar, Perak dan selamat di kebumikan pada 14 Februari, 2022 di tanah perkuburan Kampung tersebut.

Rev Bah War A/L Bah Rantau, berasal dari Kampung Ulu Gruntum, Gopeng, Perak. Lahir pada 11 Ogos 1944. Beliau mula mengikuti kursus Alkitab di Maktab Injil Malaysia, Lawas, Sarawak pada tahun 1972 selama 3 tahun dan berjaya menyelesaikan kursus theologi pada tahun 1974. Beliau mula melayani dengan Persidangan Misi Sengoi Methodist pada tahun 1975 dan pada tahun 1981 beliau ditabiskan menjadi Diakon dan Elder pada tahun 1984. Beliau telah bersara pada tahun 2000 setelah 25 tahun melayani.

Setelah bersara dari Persidangan Misi Sengoi Methodist beliau melayani di Malaysian Care selama 15 tahun, mulai tahun 2000 sehingga 2015. Semasa itu beliau juga terlibat dalam penterjemahan Alkitab Bahasa Semai selama 3 tahun iaitu pada tahun 2003 sehingga tahun 2005. Selanjutnya pada tahun 2005 sehingga 2011 selama 7 tahun, melalui Malaysian Care beliau melayani di Persatuan Orang kelainan Upaya di Taiping.

Beliau berkahwin dengan Ngah Unah Binti Ngah Cichah pada 17-4-1977 (kini balu berumur 64 tahun) yang berasal dari Kampung Ulu Bekor, Balang Manong, Kuala Kangsar, Perak. Hasil dari perkongsian hidup mereka Tuhan telah mengurniakan 5 cahayamata, anak sulung yang sudah berkeluarga bernama Robin kini berumur 45 tahun, anak kedua yang sudah berkeluarga bernama Ronal kini berumur 41 tahun, dan anak perempuan mereka yang kembar bernama Suria dan Diana kini berumur 34 tahun, dan yang bongsu bernama Zack kini berumur 21 tahun.



The 17th Triennial General Assembly of the Council of Churches Malaysia

The 17th Triennial General Assembly of the Council of Churches Malaysia was held from 27-28th April 2022, with 113 delegates from across denominations attending online from all over the nation, with 5 more meeting in-person at the CCM Ecumenical Centre. Our Trinity Annual Conference sent 17 delegates.

We opened with the Word expounded by the 9th Anglican Bishop in Singapore, Rt. Revd. Rennis Ponniah on Romans 8:12-39 with the theme, "Come Holy Spirit". He encouraged the delegates to be affirmed in their identity as debtors to the Lord, adopted children of God, and co-heirs with Christ. His challenge was that the Church was to be "a holy, united and self-giving people, a sign-post of the glorious new age that will fully come."

The CCM Secretary General, Rev. Dr. Hermen Shastri, presented his report and shared the theme for the 17th Triennium Period of 2022-2025, which is "Come Holy Spirit. Heal, Renew and Reconcile the Whole Creation" from Romans 8:12, with the sub themes of the each year being guided by the imploration for the Holy Spirit to come to Heal (2022), Renew (2023), and Reconcile (2024).

Rev. Dr. Hermen Shastri also shared about how the CCM Ecumenical Centre was a source of blessing to Malaysians during the pandemic, and how CCM had been instrumental in providing pandemic safety SOPs to the Christian community during a time

when such direction was needed. During this time, the issues of the Ukraine-Russian war as well as the continued absence of Pastors Raymond Koh, Joshua Hilmy, Ruth Sitepu, and activist Amri Che Mat were raised for dialogue.

The following office bearers were then elected for the 17th Triennium Period of 2022-2025:

As the meeting concluded, the assembly thanked Outgoing President, Archbishop Datuk Melter Tais, and outgoing General Secretary, Rev. Dr. Hermen Shastri, for their faithful service and stewardship.

May the work of CCM continue to further the cause of the Kingdom as we bid the Holy Spirit to come and Heal, Renew, and Reconcile the Whole Creation.
